This past year's activities which have helped us continue our mission are:

- Developed a number of new exhibits and revised existing exhibits with enhanced information, photos and artifacts in the Gaston Building museum. "Pop-Up" featuring American Legion Centennial
- Preservation of the Butterfield Cottage as an interpretive exhibit of Seaside's history through the years as a beach vacation community; first special lecture session by LaRee Johnson. Picket fence rebuild started.
- The Butterfield Heritage gardens is designed with heirloom plants only, including a new Dahlia bed, thanks to the Sou'Wester Garden Club (with more significant improvements coming in 2024!)
- Availability of research materials in a resource center and assistance to residents and visitors in tracing family heritage, houses, buildings, yearbooks, etc. New website! Three newsletters published.
- Presentation of the popular History & Hops speaker series held at the Seaside Brewing Co.
- Presentation of the Lewis & Clark Salt Makers event bringing awareness to the role Seaside played in the historic mission. Featured in new Oregon Field Guide episode.
- Collection, enhancement, and restoration of photographs of Seaside over the years.
- Visited by 100+ Pacific Ridge third grade students in June

Activities planned for the 2024 year include:

- Museum closed for January 2024 to remodel, refresh
- Diorama rededication and celebrating Seaside's 125th Birthday on 2/17/24
- Continuation of Lewis & Clark Salt Makers event planned for September 7-8, 2024. This was funded by the City of Seaside Tourism grant in 2023; we are hopeful it will be funded again in 2024
- Continued partnership with the Seaside Tourism Bureau, other community partners
- Creation of small exhibits which can be displayed at, and in partnership with, businesses and public locations throughout Seaside.
- Digitizing our resource library and archives to make the materials available to the public via the Internet Archive
- Continuation of the popular History & Hops series
- Continued maintenance/repairs of museum facilities
- Butterfield Cottage Preservation Project - carrying out the work needed to preserve the 130 year old beach cottage museum.

We remain steadfast in our quest to offer a visual representation of Seaside's past by developing new exhibits, such as "Seaside Volunteer Fire Department". As the times move forward, so does the museum. We continue to update existing exhibits to meet the current industry standard.

- Mother's Day Tea - Saturday & Sunday, May 11th and 12th, at Butterfield Cottage
- 4th of July Cakewalk at the Museum - if we get enough volunteers!

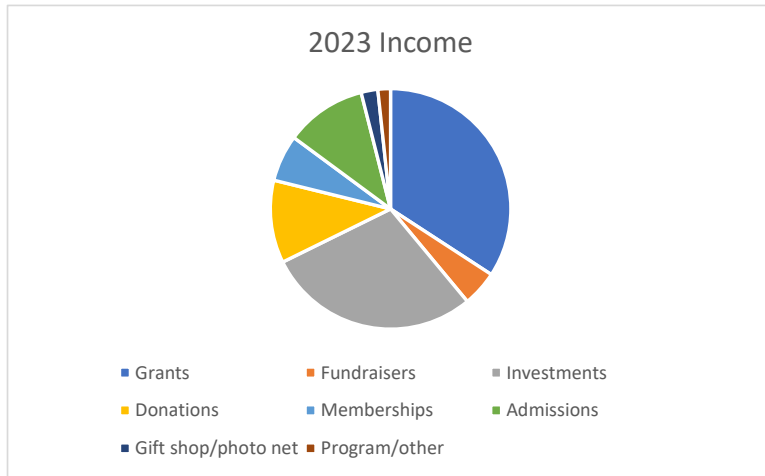


As always I am very thankful for our members, our core group of volunteers and our great board members. Each and every one of us has a part to play in keeping our museum able to tell the history of Seaside.
